Colorado National Guard breaking ground on Windsor readiness center

WINDSOR - The Colorado Army National Guard planned to break ground on a new readiness center in Windsor Thursday.

Site work for the project began in September and the facility is expected to be completed in September 2012. The 17-acre facility will be the home of approximately 130 soldiers in the 1157th Forward Support Company of the 1st Battalion, 157th Infantry Regiment, a new light infantry unit of the Colorado National Guard.

At any given time, about 130 people will be at work on the project, which will provide jobs for 435 workers over the course of the construction.

Adolfson and Peterson Construction, based in Aurora, is general contractor for the project, which is based on designs by RB+B Architects of Fort Collins.

Other readiness centers are being constructed in Alamosa, Fort Lupton, Grand Junction and Colorado Springs.

The project includes a 30,175-square-foot facility with an assembly hall, maintenance training work bay, classrooms, kitchen, recruiting office, family support office, supply storage, locker areas and administrative offices. The address of the center is 31725 Great Western Drive.
